The vast majority of the curriculum can be taught outdoors, not just in the early years but throughout the 3-12 curriculum and beyond. The Love Outdoor Learning approach is all about educators using the skills they already have to create active, practical and engaging lessons outdoors that support the curriculum.

Why do we think our approach is great?

- It is simple; it uses the skills and knowledge educators already have
- It takes minimal time and limited resources; we use resources that are already in schools.
- It is for all, small groups or whole classes, children in mainstream or those with additional learning needs.
- It connects children to their environment, creating a sense of place and supporting their mental health.
- It can be done anywhere, whilst a green space is nice, we are not reliant on it.
